


Upload Screen







Podcasting is easy,

Producing content is hard!

- 1. What is your podcast about?
- 2. Who is your audience?
- 3. What is your format?
 - Interviews
 - Produced reports
 - Conversations
- 4. What makes your podcast unique and interesting?

Tips:

- Figure out who your audience is and what will interest them
- Deliver content where your audience is
- Be realistic about the time commitment
- Find interesting guests
- Be interesting yourself
- Pre-interview
- Send questions to your guests ahead of time
- How will you pay for the podcast?
- Come up with a monetization plan and execute it
- Come up with a promotion plan and execute it
